ABOUT DECEMBER'S ARTISTS

Ananda Sukarlan - Piano

The pianist Ananda Sukarlan is known for his collaboration with Spain's most important contemporary composers in premières of their works in Spain and internationally. He has recorded the complete piano works of David del Puerto, Santiago Lanchares and Toru Takemitsu, as well as being a dedicatee of new works by Per Nørgaard, Peter Sculthorpe, John McLeod and more than fifty other prominent composers. Ananda Sukarlan is also certainly Indonesia's most prominent composer, with numerous international commissions and performances. His collaboration with the renowned Indonesian choreographer Chendra Panatan has given birth to many works for ballet, performed both in Europe and Indonesia. His first opera,

based on the script by Seno Gumira Ajidarma, *Mengapa Kau Culik Anak Kami?* (Why did you kidnap our son?), based on a true story during the Suharto dictatorship, had its première in 2008 in Jakarta. His compositions include works for orchestra, chamber music and solo instruments, but it is his vocal compositions, art-songs, choral works and theatre works, that have consolidated his high reputation as a composer. A National Piano Competition, the Ananda Sukarlan Award, has been established in Indonesia to help the career of young pianists.

Richard Svoboda - Bassoon

Richard Svoboda has been principal bassoonist of the Boston Symphony Orchestra and a member of the Boston Symphony Chamber Players since 1989. He is currently on the faculties of the New England Conservatory of Music and the Tanglewood Music Center. He has also taught at the Sarasota Music Festival, the Grand Teton Orchestral Seminar, the Popkin-Glickman Bassoon Camp, and the Symphony School of America, and has given master classes throughout the world. Prior to his appointment to the BSO, he performed for ten seasons as principal bassoonist of the Jacksonville Symphony. He studied with William Winstead, George Berry, and Gary Echols. Mr. Svoboda appears frequently with chamber ensembles, as orchestral soloist, and in recital. Among his solo appearances with the Boston Symphony Orchestra have been performances of John Williams's bassoon concerto *The Five Sacred Trees* with the composer conducting, as well as Weber's Concerto for Bassoon under the baton of Seiji Ozawa. A Nebraska native, Mr. Svoboda graduated with high distinction from the University of Nebraska, where he received a bachelor of music in education degree. He is married and has four daughters.

John Ferrillo - Oboe

John Ferrillo joined the Boston Symphony Orchestra as principal oboe at the start of the 2001 Tanglewood season, having appeared with the orchestra several times as a guest performer in previous seasons. From 1986 to 2001 he was principal oboe of the Metropolitan Opera Orchestra. Mr. Ferrillo grew up in Bedford, Massachusetts, and played in the Greater Boston Youth Symphony Orchestra. He is a graduate of the Curtis Institute, where he studied with John deLancie and received his diploma and Artist's certificate. He also studied with John Mack at the Blossom Festival and has participated in the Marlboro, Craftsbury, and Monadnock festivals. Prior to his appointment at the Metropolitan Opera, Mr. Ferrillo was second oboe of the San Francisco Symphony, and was a faculty member at Illinois State University and West Virginia State University. A former faculty member of the Mannes School of Music and Juilliard School of Music in New York City, he has taught and performed at the Aspen and Waterloo festivals and currently serves on the faculty of the New England Conservatory, Boston University, and the Boston University Tanglewood Institute.

James Sommerville – French Horn

James Sommerville is Principal Horn of the Boston Symphony Orchestra, a position he has held since 1998. He is also Music Director of the Hamilton Philharmonic Orchestra. The winner of the highest prizes at the Munich, Toulon, and CBC competitions, Mr. Sommerville has pursued a solo career that has spanned 25 years, and has brought critically acclaimed appearances with major orchestras throughout North America and Europe. His disc of the Mozart Horn Concertos with the CBC Vancouver Orchestra won the JUNO Award for Best Classical Recording in Canada. Other award-winning CBC recordings include the Britten Serenade for Tenor, Horn, and Strings and Britten's Canticle. Mr. Sommerville has recorded chamber music for the Deutsche Gramophon, Telarc, CBC, Summit, and Marquis labels. He is a member of the Boston Symphony Chamber Players, with whom he tours and records regularly.

Erin Svoboda – Clarinet

Clarinetist Erin Svoboda is an active orchestral and chamber musician currently with the Salt Lake City Symphony Orchestra. She has performed with ensembles such as The Metropolitan Opera, American Symphony, and New York City Opera, Sarasota Opera, and Princeton Symphony, as well as with the Daedalus Quartet, neoLIT ensemble, Firebird Ensemble, Azure Ensemble, and Ensemble 212. She has also attended the Marlboro, Tanglewood, Pacific, and Aspen Music Festivals.

Erin can be heard on Bright Sheng's Tibetan Dances on the album Spring Dreams. She has worked closely with composers John Harbison, Yehudi Wyner, and Augusta Read Thomas and gave the world premiere of Michael Gandolfi's Clarinet and Bassoon Concerto in 2010. Erin holds degrees from the New England

Conservatory, Temple University, and the Manhattan School of Music and has studied with Ricardo Morales, Mark Nuccio, and Thomas Martin.

Katie Zagorski - Flute

Katie Zagórski graduated with first class honours from the ANU School of Music before taking up a scholarship position at the Australian National Academy of Music. She has been a finalist in the New Zealand Flute Competition, the ABC Young Performer of the Year Award, a winner of the Victorian Flute Guild Competition and a winner of the

Australian International Flute Competition. In addition to an active chamber music and solo career, Katie has played principal flute with the Australian Youth Orchestra and frequently plays with the Australian Chamber Orchestra and the Sydney, Melbourne, Queensland and Tasmanian Symphony Orchestras. She has performed concerti with Orchestra Victoria and the Tasmanian Symphony Orchestra, has been an artist in residence at The Banff Centre, Canada, and competed in the Carl Nielsen International Flute Competition, Denmark, 2010. In 2011, Katie was a Sydney Symphony Fellow and in 2012 was on contract with the Queensland Symphony Orchestra as Associate Principal Flute. This year, Katie was the soloist for the Cologne Chamber Philharmonic on their tour of Australia, playing both piccolo and flute concerti, and most recently enjoyed touring with the Australian Chamber Orchestra. In 2014 she looks forward to a self-directed artist residency at the Banff Centre, Canada.
